- (2) The expansion and completion of the organization of Farmers' Forum and the utilization of the Forums for agricultural development.

Apart from the above, it has been arranged to take farmers around the various Agricultural Research Stations. Exhibits and cinema shows have been arranged every evening for their education and entertainment.
